Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:45 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with supervisors Bardole, Burkett, Contner, Muir and Rudolph present. As the courthouse remains closed to the public due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the meeting was made available electronically, audio only, through zoom.us. Motion by Contner, second by Rudolph to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Bardole, second by Burkett to approve the minutes of March 30, 2020. Motion carried unanimously.

Chuck Wenthold reported that there are two construction applications requiring master matrix review and public hearings. Stumpf Finisher in Section 32, Highland Twp will have matrix review on April 20th at 9:00 a.m., hearing on April 27th at 9:00 a.m. Sadoris Site in Section 2, S Junction Twp will have matrix review at 9:10 a.m. April 20th, hearing on April 27th at 9:20 a.m. The board will still be having electronic meetings for both.

Ambulance director Michele Madsen reported an increase in calls. Sheriff Jack Williams reported that his office responded to a large gathering (party) of more than forty individuals, and again recommended the board consider a county social host ordinance.

County attorney Thomas Laehn reported assistant county attorney Laura Snider is convening a Court Access Advisory Board whose purpose will be to ensure access to the court system. Laehn offered clarification to the board about emergency paid leave created in response to the COVID-19 virus. The law allows exclusion of certain categories of employees from the guarantee of emergency paid leave, including Sheriff, Ambulance, County Attorney and Secondary Road employees. Presently the board is allowing eligibility to all employees, but this may change if deemed necessary by the board at some point in time. Laehn reviewed an Emergency Paid Sick Leave and Public Health Emergency Leave Employee Election document to be used by those employees eligible for such leave.

Motion by Rudolph, second by Burkett to accept the Sheriff's Quarterly Report of Fees for January through March, the Auditor's Passport Report for January through March, and the Recorder's March Report of Fees. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Contner, second by Bardole to approve a Class B beer permit for Lakeside National Golf Club, LLC. Motion carried unanimously.

Engineer Wade Weiss reviewed the FY21 Secondary Roads IDOT Budget and the Five-year Construction Program with the board noting there were no changes from what was presented to the board during the county's FY21 budget process. Weiss noted that new equipment purchases may be put on hold due to the likely reduction of road use tax monies. Motion by Contner, second by Bardole to approve the FY21 Secondary Roads IDOT Budget and the Secondary Roads Five-year Program as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Burkett, second by Bardole to approve Resolution 2020-20 for transfer of funds:

WHEREAS Iowa Code §331.432 requires the board to authorize transfers to the secondary roads fund in accordance with §331.429, subsection 1,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors authorizes the transfer of \$586,147 from the Rural fund and \$162,500 from the LOSST fund in accordance with the transfers approved for the current fiscal year. Both transfers are second one-half funding for FY20.

Aye: Bardole, Burkett, Contner, Muir, Rudolph. Resolution unanimously approved.

Motion by Contner, second by Burkett to approve claims for payment. Motion carried unanimously.

Supervisor Dawn Rudolph reported participation in Board of Health and Grow Greene County meetings.

Chair Muir adjourned the meeting at 9:40 a.m.
