Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:45 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with supervisors Bardole, Burkett, Contner and Rudolph in person, and Chair Muir electronically. As the courthouse remains closed to the public due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the meeting was made available electronically, audio only, through zoom.us. Those from the media participating electronically included Janice Harbaugh, Coltrane Carlson and Rick Morain. Muir requested, and Rudolph agreed to lead the meeting from the boardroom. Motion by Contner, second by Burkett to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Bardole, second by Burkett to approve the minutes of April 20, 2020. Motion carried unanimously.

Chuck Wenthold reported participation in the North Raccoon Watershed meeting held last week. Wenthold shared that the watershed area map had been drawn by the U.S. Geological Survey to include the North Raccoon and Raccoon watershed areas. Dallas and Polk County officials were not involved in that decision. Engineer Wade Weiss reported that gravel haul continues in the county. Weiss discussed an upcoming road closure resolution pertaining to airport road relocation work and reaching the final stage of a bridge project on County road E18. County attorney Thomas Laehn reported bullet-resistant glass has now been installed in the offices of the clerk of court and county attorney.

Supervisor Pete Bardole gave reports for meetings of the Bell Tower Foundation, Chamber, GCDC Exec committee, Central Iowa Juvenile Detention Center and EOC. Supervisor Dawn Rudolph noted participation for a short time in an electronic CICS meeting for the mental health region.

Chair Muir and Chuck Wenthold reported that public hearings for two construction permit applications (Stumpf Finishers LLC site, Section 32 Highland Twp, and Saddoris site, Section 2 South Junction Twp), originally scheduled for this meeting, have been rescheduled on May 11th at 9:00 a.m. and 9:20 a.m., respectively. Each are proposed two-barn sites with 4,992 hogs. Letters are being resent to those landowners within a two-mile radius of each site for clarification about buildings and hog totals.

Chris Henning, participating electronically, discussed the local farmers market, held annually on the east side of the courthouse. Governor Reynolds has announced some guidelines for these markets to be able to resume; while many uncertainties remain about holding a local market at this time due to the coronavirus pandemic, Henning said that no decisions have been made for the local market. Ginny Showman, also participating electronically and chair of the Art on the Square committee for the Bell Tower Festival, shared rescheduling update for this year's event. The festival has been postponed until the 29th of August.

Motion by Bardole, second by Burkett to approve Resolution 2020-22 reclassifying a part-time EMT to full-time EMT:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Greene County Board of Supervisors approved appointing Allison Powell as full-time EMT at an annual rate of \$32,000 effective April 6, 2020.

Aye: Bardole, Burkett, Contner, Muir, Rudolph. Resolution unanimously approved.

Motion by Burkett, second by Contner to approve claims for payment and E911 checks for auditor signature. Motion carried unanimously. Rudolph then adjourned the meeting at 9:05 a.m.
