Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with all supervisors present: Bardole, Burkett, Contner, Muir, Rudolph. Motion by Contner, second by Bardole to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Rudolph, second by Burkett to approve the minutes of June 15, 2020. Motion carried unanimously.

Chris Henning, participating electronically, requested the board to formally state whether the local farmers market could be held on the courthouse square beginning either July 7th or 14th and ending in early September. Henning indicated courthouse restrooms must be open for the public for this to occur. After some discussion, Chair John Muir, on behalf of the board, gave Henning the go-ahead for farmers market, i.e., restrooms will be available. Muir added a caveat that this approval could change should circumstances such as a surge in COVID cases occur in the county.

Auditor Jane Heun reported depositing a cashier's check for \$54,383 in the county's general fund from the liquidation of the accounts of Greene County Community Service. A letter from attorney Rita Harmening-Pedersen notes "the entity has discontinued operating, and its assets, upon dissolution, are payable to the county."

Supervisors Pete Bardole and John Muir reported participation in an EOC meeting last week. County attorney Thomas Laehn talked about reviving community service and possibly finding a volunteer to oversee that service. Laehn also addressed the board about a draft proposal (agreement) between the hospital and county for funding of public health services, noting that he would require more time to determine whether a contract or 28E agreement might be the appropriate means for determining financial commitment to public health.

Engineer Wade Weiss, participating electronically, reported that gravel hauling has been completed, patching continues and the sign in the tower is to be completed this week.

Diane Hinderaker of Boone/Greene County Probation was present to report on probation services provided to clients in Greene County. Hinderaker reported that, as of June 1st, 29 clients are currently being supervised for 33 cases. Hinderaker provided a breakdown of those cases. County attorney Laehn explained that the current contract with Boone/Greene County Probation was amended in February to expand probation cases and automatically renew from year to year subject to either party giving notice of termination. Current funding is at \$8,515.08 per year with additional expenses limited to 5% above that fee. Hinderaker indicated that no changes to the contract are necessary at this time.

Motion by Bardole, second by Contner to approve Resolution 2020-30 to appropriate FY21 funding:

WHEREAS Iowa Code 331.434 (6.) requires the board of supervisors to appropriate, by resolution, the amounts deemed necessary for each of the different county officers and departments during the ensuing fiscal year,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Greene County Board of Supervisors hereby appropriates 85% of the total budgeted expenditures to each of the county officers and departments for FY21.

Aye: Bardole, Burkett, Contner, Muir, Rudolph. Resolution unanimously approved.

At 9:20 a.m., motion by Burkett, second by Contner to adjourn to a drainage meeting for DD191 (pay estimate #2, change order #1, schedule completion hearing). The board returned to its regular meeting at 9:25 a.m.

Motion by Contner, second by Bardole to approve claims for payment. Motion carried unanimously. Muir adjourned the meeting. A tour of the Midland Cooperative building is planned for later today at 4:00 p.m.
