Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with all supervisors present: Burkett, Contner, Muir, Richardson, Rudolph.

Motion by Richardson, second by Rudolph to approve the agenda as amended to include consideration of a class C native wine permit. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Burkett, second by Richardson to approve the minutes of October 20, 2014. Motion carried unanimously.

Supervisor Dawn Rudolph reported attending a Heart of Iowa Community Services Commission meeting and Supervisor Guy Richardson discussed an Airport Commission meeting that he attended. Chair John Muir read a request for overnight travel for Deputy Nathaniel Chapman while attending training. The request was granted.

Bob Ausberger addressed the board during open forum. Ausberger explained that pre-applications are being accepted by the Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship (IDALS) for water quality demonstration projects until November 17th. According to the IDALS handout, the funding focus will be for projects that have a positive impact on water quality. Ausberger is a proponent of a project in DD115 and has asked for the board's backing in the form of a letter of support should the project become eligible either now or later. The board agreed to continue discussion at its next meeting.

Executive director Mick Tageson of Elderbridge Agency on Aging was present for his annual update and funding request for the agency. Tageson provided an annual report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014 highlighting services provided to each of its member counties in both service units and dollars. Tageson pointed out that the FY14 funding request of \$2.75 per senior (age 60+) had returned \$71.81 (2611%) spending average on Greene County seniors. He requested match funding totaling \$7,002 for the fiscal 2016 year. No action was taken at this time.

Motion by Richardson, second by Contner to abate property taxes totaling \$3,278 on the Sierra Community Theatre. Prior to a vote, Jim Daubendiek answered questions from Supervisor Tom Contner regarding the financial condition of the theatre and its non-profit status. Karen Voge-Perkins also asked that the board support the abatement. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Richardson, second by Contner to approve a Class C Native wine permit for Deal Orchard. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Rudolph, second by Richardson to approve claims for payment and auditor signing of E911 checks. Motion carried unanimously.

At 9:50 a.m., motion to adjourn by Richardson, second by Burkett. Motion carried unanimously.
