Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with all supervisors present: Burkett, Contner, Muir, Richardson, Rudolph.

Motion by Richardson, second by Burkett to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Contner, second by Richardson to approve the minutes of July 27, 2015. Motion carried unanimously.

Sanitarian Tim Healy informed the board that S & A Partners (Scott Walker/Adam Bauer) has refiled plans for a 7,488 head hog finishing unit in Section 25 of Paton Township. Healy additionally informed the board that Davis Hog & Grain (Birtan Davis) has filed plans for an expansion of a hog finishing unit to 4,992 head in Section 23 of Franklin Township. Both require master matrix scoring followed by scheduled public hearings.

Supervisor Mick Burkett reported attending a meeting of the Pioneer Cemetery commission.

With Shane Olson again present for the meeting, the supervisors discussed Olson's suggestion that a county jake brake ordinance be written to include a specific time frame each day when unmuffled engine brakes could not be used. After further discussion, a 10 p.m. until 6 a.m. time frame was determined to be acceptable as part of the yet-to-be considered ordinance.

At 9:00 a.m., motion by Richardson, second by Rudolph to adjourn to a drainage meeting for DD114 (consider consent agreement with I.D.O.T.). The board returned to regular session at 9:10 a.m.

Michelle Fields then reported to the supervisors some of the HIPAA policy issues that have been recognized as a result of the committee's meetings. Fields noted that proper training will correct many of the issues, but noted that certain security "access" issues may also involve some expenses to correct.

Assessor Linda Spearman distributed a draft of a value added tax exemption ordinance to the board to be considered for readings after a public hearing date is set and published.

Chair John Muir departed from the meeting at 9:15 a.m. Engineer Wade Weiss discussed a request for assistance tearing down and hauling away two existing sheep barns at the fairgrounds in the next phase of building improvements there. Weiss also reported on the bike trail road crossings project.

Chair Pro Tem Guy Richardson adjourned the meeting at 9:40 a.m.
