Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with supervisors Bardole, Burkett, Contner and Muir present. Absent: Rudolph. Motion by Burkett, second by Bardole to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Burkett, second by Contner to approve the minutes of August 28, 2017. Motion carried unanimously.

Supervisor Peter Bardole reported attending meetings of the Bell Tower Foundation and Central Iowa Juvenile Detention Center boards. Supervisor Mick Burkett reported attending a Pioneer Cemetery commission meeting. Thomas Laehn (assistant to county attorney) reported he has been attending Greene County Domestic Violence Coalition meetings. Laehn indicated he would like to improve the prosecution success rate for domestic violence.

Chuck Wenthold provided the board with copies of an updated version of Watershed Coordinator Proposal, Central Iowa Watershed Management Authorities. Wenthold distributed a master matrix scoring document for Youngblood Site, Section 25 of Bristol Twp to be reviewed at next week's meeting. Wenthold informed the board of an application received for three new buildings (7490 head) proposed by Grey Owl Farms VI, LLC (Kave Farm Finisher Site) in Section 27 of Highland Township.

Main Street director Peg Raney provided an update of Jefferson Matters: Main Street. Raney reviewed 2017 priorities and then discussed many of the Main Street committees' projects and activities planned or already completed. Raney also shared Jefferson's new brand to be used in wayfinding signage for the community.

Motion by Contner, second by Burkett to approve separate 28E agreements between Greene County and the city of Scranton for law enforcement service and municipal ordinance service. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Bardole, second by Burkett to approve a forgivable mortgage release for a down payment assistance program property (1000 E Lincoln Way, Jefferson). Motion carried unanimously.

Dennis Morlan, emergency management director, addressed the board, acting as the Emergency Management Commission, regarding the adoption of Emergency Support Function (ESF) #10. Morlan shared the annual update of that ESF. Motion by Contner, second by Burkett to adopt ESF 10 – Oil and Hazardous Materials Response – 2017. Motion carried unanimously.

Engineer Wade Weiss shared information regarding secondary roads open positions and transfers within the department. He discussed damage to roads due to wind turbine construction and how the department is dealing with the repairs.

Chair Muir adjourned the meeting at 10:10 a.m.
