Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with supervisors Burkett, Contner, Muir and Richardson present. Absent: Rudolph.

Motion by Richardson, second by Contner to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Burkett, second by Contner to approve the minutes of September 21, 2015. Motion carried unanimously.

Supervisors Tom Contner and Mick Burkett reported attending meetings of the New Opportunities board and 2nd Judicial District commission, respectively. Sheriff Steve Hauptert requested that the board schedule time at its October 19th meeting to hear Steve Lukan, director of the Iowa Office of Drug Control Policy regarding substance abuse issues, policy, education, prevention, etc. as it relates to high risk behavior by children.

Overnight travel to participate in Fall conferences in Cedar Rapids were informally approved for Nick Martino, Jane Heun and Billie Hoskins.

Motion by Contner, second by Richardson to approve claims for payment and auditor signing of E911 checks. Motion carried unanimously.

At 9:00 a.m., motion by Richardson, second by Contner to adjourn to drainage meetings for DD27 and DD108 (requests for engineer's report to reshape surface drains). Motion carried unanimously. The board returned to regular session at 9:10 a.m.

Peg Raney and Deb McGinn were present to update the board on Jefferson Matters: Main Street projects. McGinn reviewed plans for an annual sculpture contest whereby the top three winning sculptures would remain on display for one year on the Tower plaza. Raney discussed a recent market analysis study completed with a consultant's assistance and other projects being undertaken.

Motion by Contner, second by Burkett to approve a class C beer permit for Paton Pit Stop. Motion carried unanimously.

Carey Kersey, director of environmental health for Carroll County, addressed the board regarding the environmental health services her office provides. Currently inspections of tanning beds and swimming pools are performed in Greene County by her office. Kersey reviewed other services her office provides, including water testing, well plugging and rehabilitation, well and septic permitting, etc. Kersey also shared a 28E agreement for services between Carroll and Crawford counties as an example should the board be interested in contracting for services in the future.

Chair Muir adjourned the meeting at 10:15 a.m.
