Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with supervisors Burkett, Contner, Muir and Rudolph present and supervisor Richardson participating by speaker phone.

Motion by Contner, second by Richardson to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Burkett, second by Rudolph to approve the minutes of March 9, 2015. Motion carried unanimously.

Supervisors Dawn Rudolph and Mick Burkett reported attending an emergency preparedness meeting with public health officials. Chair John Muir reported that he and drain clerk Michelle Fields had gone to the County Day at the Capitol to discuss the Des Moines Water Works lawsuit against Calhoun-Buena Vista-Sac counties drainage districts with local legislators.

During open forum, George Naylor discussed five new hog confinements to be built in the county all under the master matrix threshold. Naylor emphasized that the board needs to be aware, even though the board has no control over these units.

Michelle Fields, IT director, talked about an upcoming cyber security conference for county officials to attend. She also requested that a supervisor consider becoming a member of the county's HIPAA committee.

Jane Fallon, Vice President & General Manager for Cargill Pork LLC addressed the board about a potential feed mill project being considered for Greene County east of Grand Junction. Fallon emphasized the project is still in a research stage and if completed would employ ten to fifteen at the location and produce 350,000 tons of feed per year. Fallon answered questions of the board and others present.

Motion by Contner, second by Burkett to approve a Class B beer (BB) permit for Lakeside Golf Club, Inc. Motion carried unanimously.

Supervisor Guy Richardson discontinued his meeting participation at this time.

Motion by Rudolph, second by Burkett to accept the Treasurer's Investment & Driver's License Report for February. Motion carried unanimously.

Engineer Wade Weiss discussed the upcoming US Highway 30 Day at the Capitol meeting with the board. Estimates of additional road use tax monies for the county was shared. Weiss then discussed moving the planned purchase of a new motor grader in FY16 to the current fiscal year as the exchange of an older motor grader towards the purchase will provide a higher trade-in value if made sooner. Weiss also discussed plans for gravel crushing and purchases with the board.

Chair Muir adjourned the meeting at 10:20 a.m.
