Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with all supervisors present: Burkett, Contner, Muir, Richardson, Rudolph.

Motion by Contner, second by Rudolph to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.
Motion by Burkett, second by Richardson to approve the minutes of September 6, 2016.
Motion carried unanimously.

Chair John Muir reported attending a meeting of the newly formed North Raccoon River Watershed Authority; Supervisor Guy Richardson noted attending a Board of Health meeting and also being asked to be a member of the local Patient and Family Advisory Council.

The board informally approved overnight travel for Deputy Kirk Hammer to attend Honor Guard Training in Cedar Rapids.

Jefferson city administrator Mike Palmer updated the board on the status of city projects and promotions. New Chamber director Roccie Hill was introduced by Victoria Riley and welcomed by the board.

Motion by Contner, second by Burkett to approve claims for payment. Motion carried unanimously.

At 9:00 a.m. Chair Muir opened a public hearing for Greene County Pigs LLC in Section 5 of Franklin Township. The site, already containing pigs, had its original hearing back in March and was later approved by the IDNR. Owner Eric Chrystal had originally claimed 30 points on the matrix scoring for composting, but now desires to switch to rendering. In exchange for losing those 30 points, Chrystal is substituting landscaping points (20) which brings matrix scoring to 440 – a passing score. The board received an email message from Chris Henning questioning a distance and how often the rendering service comes each week. Additionally, Chair Muir read a letter from Patti Edwardson about her concerns and suggestions to the board of supervisors. Nancy Hanaman was present at the hearing and voiced her concerns about the need to change the way applications are scored and their numbers in the county. Owners Eric and Rhonda Chrystal and Becky Sexton (Twin Lakes Environmental Services) were all present for the hearing. At 9:15 a.m., motion by Contner, second by Richardson to close the public hearing. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Burkett, second by Richardson to recommend approval to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources based upon meeting the requirements of the master matrix, while, at the same time, noting that there are public comments and concerns. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Richardson, second by to approve Resolution 2016-26:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Greene County approves hiring Joshua Derry as full time jailer at \$14/hour effective September 12, 2016. Upon certification, the rate will increase to \$15/hour.

Roll call vote: Aye: Burkett, Contner, Muir, Richardson, Rudolph. Motion carried unanimously.

Chief Deputy Jack Williams reviewed a funding request for a new garage door at the law enforcement center, explaining that the budget for the LEC in the current year did not include plans to replace the garage door, which now is necessary. Williams requested that the board approve his request for \$3,499 from Dreyfus funds for the replacement of the door and an opener. Motion by Richardson, second by Rudolph to approve the request for funding of \$3,499 for a garage door and opener at the LEC. Motion carried unanimously.

At 9:30 a.m., motion by Burkett, second by Rudolph to adjourn to a joint drainage meeting (DD150-86 with Carroll County – completion hearing). Motion carried unanimously. The board returned to its regular session at 9:50 a.m.

Engineer Wade Weiss reported that reported that the Bell Tower project is moving along, noting that the bells will be lowered next week. Weiss also noted that there will be a pre-bid walk through for the dome rehabilitation project later today.

Chair Muir adjourned the meeting at 10:10 a.m.
