Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with all supervisors present: Burkett, Contner, Muir, Richardson, Rudolph.

Motion by Richardson, second by Rudolph to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Richardson, second by Burkett to approve the minutes of January 2, 2015. Motion carried unanimously.

Deb McGinn, from the Bell Tower Festival promotion committee, requested and received approval to hold a cooking contest in the courthouse during the upcoming festival on June 13th. Pam Olerich distributed valuation comparison information for Greene and surrounding counties to the supervisors. Engineer Wade Weiss reported the planned overpass project at Grand Junction scheduled to be let in 2017. He noted that a D.O.T. consultant is looking at the feasibility of moving a section of beam from the existing bridge to the Interpretive Site area when the bridge is replaced.

Mary Tighe, Greene County Ag Extension mentoring coordinator, distributed a proclamation and requested the board to proclaim January as Mentoring Month in Greene County. Motion by Richardson, second by Rudolph to proclaim January 2015 Mentoring Month in Greene County, Iowa. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Richardson, second by Burkett to accept the Recorder's Report of Fees for December and the Auditor's Quarterly Report of Passport Fees for October through December. Motion carried unanimously.

Wayne Taylor and Shirley Clark presented for Jefferson Congregate Meals. During the year the Jefferson site began preparing meals for delivery to Scranton residents in addition to those already prepared for delivery to Grand Junction and Churdan residents. The funding request for FY16 remains at \$5,000.

Alan Robinson, Main Street director, updated the board regarding Jefferson Matters: Main Street Iowa. The program is ending its first three years of operation and will be seeking new pledges for continuation. Robinson discussed the Empty Building tour and other aspects of the program, noting two specialists will be in Jefferson to help with the upcoming fundraising program. Robinson also thanked the board for its support of the program.

Chair Muir adjourned the meeting at 9:45 a.m.
