Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with all supervisors present: Burkett, Contner, Muir, Richardson, Rudolph.

Motion by Burkett, second by Richardson to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Richardson, second by Burkett to approve the minutes of May 9, 2016. Motion carried unanimously.

Chair John Muir gave a report of a Central Iowa Juvenile Detention Commission meeting and Supervisor Guy Richardson reported attending a GCDC board meeting. Muir also reported plans to replace current lighting with more efficient LED lighting in the offices of the assessor, recorder, treasurer, clerk and magistrate.

Environmental health director Chuck Wenthold reported that he will be sending a letter of intent to Carroll County Environmental Health with notification of Greene County's intent to perform its own pool, tanning and tattoo parlor inspections upon his certification and a contract between the state and Greene's board of health.

Motion by Richardson, second by Contner to set a hearing on June 6, 2016 at 9:00 a.m. for the sale of three county properties in Dana. Motion carried unanimously.

Boone County attorney Dan Kolacia and Don Anderson presented the board with a proposal (28E agreement) between Boone and Greene counties whereby collection of delinquent court obligations, including collections under the County Attorney payment plan for driver's license reinstatement, would be performed at the county level. Greene County's current collections of delinquent court fines and fees are made through a private collection agency's agreement with the State that takes on the debt after thirty days when no collection progress is made. That agency collects an additional 25% on top of the amount owed. Kolacia stated that Boone County already collects its own delinquent court obligations but would like to join with Greene and perhaps Sac County to better reach a debt collection threshold of \$100,000, thereby guaranteeing a higher percent of the funds that may be retained by the counties. No additional penalty would be added to the existing fines and fees. The supervisors agreed to look at a future 28E agreement with Boone County and possibly Sac County.

Motion by Rudolph, second by Burkett to approve an Economic Development & Public Facilities Set-Asides draw (request for payment) for \$250,000 from the Iowa Department of Economic Development. Motion carried unanimously. The draw is for flow through grant funds for Scranton Manufacturing.

Discussion was held regarding a vacancy created on the county's Board of Health due to the resignation of Dr. David Jaskey. Once a recommendation for a physician is made, approval will be on the supervisor agenda.

Motion by Richardson, second by Rudolph to accept the Treasurer's Investment and Driver's License Report for April. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Richardson, second by Burkett to approve an agreement between the State of Iowa I.D.O.T. and Greene County and Union Pacific Railroad Company for the construction and cost participation covering the installation of safety improvements at the railroad crossing at Milepost 243.47 on C Avenue – Project No. RRP-RR02(187)- - 8A-00. Motion carried unanimously.

Engineer Wade Weiss discussed receipt of the banner poles, a quote from Janssen Waterproofing for the bell tower, and the bases placed on the north sidewalk of the courthouse to be used for the sculptures designed for the Bell Tower Festival Ring Out for Art sculpture contest.

Chair Muir adjourned the meeting at 10:30 a.m.
